

Orphan Grain Train Arizona is up and running. Rendell Odum, from You Matter Ministries, stopped to pick up 15 assorted boxes. La Mesa Homeless Ministries picked up 3 boxes. The volunteer from Mesa, Jennifer, also signed up as a regular volunteer. On Tuesday, October 19th, Atonement Lutheran middle school students, along with two teachers and Pastor Larson from Atonement Lutheran Church donated some much-needed school supplies and stayed for two hours helping to sort clothing and shoes that others had donated. On November 5, OGT Arizona drove a 26 foot truck to Sells, Arizona on the Tohonho O'odham reservation and delivered much needed clothing, shoes, school supplies and durable medical equipment.

Orphan Grain Train Arizona, is always looking for volunteers to help sort and pack donated items and help with delivering these items to various charities around Arizona. Currently OGT Arizona is open the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month from 8 am to 12 pm (although we are adjusting the dates in November and December to account for the holidays). 

It could be that they see life as being ½ filled or even ½ empty when instead they need help in seeing life as a bigger glass! Aging is a blessing to be celebrated and laughed at, rather than a burden to endure. Our "sixth sense" enables us to live an "ever-laughing life!" Start each morning looking in the mirror and you will always be reminded that the Lord really does have a sense of humor!

Father Andrew Greeley once said, "We are born with two incurable diseases – Life from which we die, and Hope – which says that death is not the end." Our sense of humor enables us to deal positively with these two realities.

Supporting our Seminary Students



Seminary student support has been an intentional objective for the LWML group at Christ Church Lutheran in Phoenix, Arizona, (Pacific Southwest District) for many years. The group usually plans two events each year to raise funds for one or more seminary students. One of these events is usually a soup supper, but the uncertainty of gathering in person caused them to instead plan a "soup supper with a twist."

A Thrivent action team grant was used to purchase mason jars and the ingredients to make soup, muffin, and mug cake mixes. All mixes were sold before Thanksgiving so that the congregation could purchase the mixes to use with their left-over Thanksgiving turkey, or to purchase as gifts. More than \$1,200 was raised through donations and sales, all of which will support a son of the congregation who is in the seminary in St. Louis.



Melissa Salomón remembers hearing gunshots in the rough Los Angeles area neighborhood where she spent her teen years. Despite her fears, she wondered how she could help. After earning a degre at Loyola Law School in Los Angeles, Melissa dove into border ministry, tenaciously living out her calling to serve

others. She established One Thousand Generations, a ministry in Tijuana, Mexico, that shares the word of the Lord and provides support to community members. Melissa's decades-long involvement in the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) has touched the lives of thousands of women, perhaps most notably through Heart to Heart Sisters, a program that prepares multicultural women to become leaders in the Lutheran church.
