## The Counselor's Corner

### Dear PSW LWML Friends -

**Waiting ...** Everyone is waiting for something!

- Some of us are waiting for our children or grandchildren to call us.
- Some of us are waiting for Jesus to come take us to our eternal, heavenly home.
- Some of us are waiting for the outdoor temperature to start getting lower.
- Some of us are waiting to be able to enter our church buildings to resume Worship.
- Some of us are waiting for news (hopefully good) from our doctor.
- Some of us are waiting for 2020 to be over.
- Most of us are waiting for an end to this Coronavirus and all the rules and regulations and social distancing and lack of smiles and hugs from family and friends!

**Waiting ...** Everyone is waiting for something!

All this talk of waiting makes me think about God's people in the Old Testament waiting ... Adam & Eve waiting for God's promise spoken in Genesis 3 to come true; the Israelites waiting 400 years in Egypt before God brings them out of slavery; during the times of the Judges when the Israelites sometimes had to wait for years before God sent a deliverer; and the centuries God's people had to wait until God finally sent the promised Messiah. I love the version where Paul talks about this in Galatians 4 when he wrote: 'when the time was right for God, He sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law in order to redeem those under the Law.'

As we continue to wait for various reasons in our lives, a question comes into our minds ... what do we do as we wait? It can get very frustrating and even depressing as we await numerous things, so what do we do? I would suggest 4 items ...

- 1) **WORSHIP** – some of you might be saying, “But Pastor, we aren't allowed to Worship in our churches yet because of the Coronavirus. That may be true for many of us, but there are other ways to still Worship ... a year before the lockdown at Canoga Park Lutheran where I serve we didn't even have the capability to record our Worship Services. But God knew what He was doing and by the time the lockdown began we were able (and still do 5+ months later) to record a Worship Service and upload it to our website so our members (and thousands of others each month) could Worship. If you haven't already, you can check with your church what Worship options there are; you can also check the LCMS Pacific Southwest District website for their listing of congregations across our District who are making online Worship available to see what options there are; you can even find congregations throughout Synod – my wife from time to time will check out the Worship Service online from our previous congregation.
- 2) **BE IN THE WORD DAILY** – how many times through the years have we heard this one? It is so important that I would encourage all of us again to be in God's Word every day. It doesn't have to be as in depth as a Bible Study, it could simply be signing up for the daily LWML Devotion that gets emailed. Perhaps you've had some extra time for your personal devotions because of this coronavirus and regulations and I'd encourage you to continue them. Perhaps you are following a Bible reading plan that will get you through the entire Bible in a year – great! The options are endless; the benefits of being in God's Word every day are eternal.

- 3) **PRAY** – Pray for all those front-line workers who come into contact with coronavirus on a daily basis; pray for those folks whose jobs are to keep us safe and secure each day; pray for those who are struggling during this time, whether it's from a loss of income, or because of the pressures in life, pray for the CDC and your state and local public health officials; pray for all those public servants, from the city council to the governor's house to Capitol Hill to the White House; pray for patience and perseverance during these times; pray for those mites and mission projects and the heart of the LWML; pray for your family and friends and your neighbors; pray for everything ... pray, Pray, PRAY.
- 4) **REACH OUT** – and here, just simply reach out to someone, maybe just a phone call, or it could be a text or email or messaging on Facebook. Ask them how they are doing, let them know – 'I'm thinking about you.' And also, 'Anything special I can include in my prayers for you?' During these coronavirus months I've used all these methods of reaching out and both of these statements and have been astounded by the response – people are so thankful and appreciative of that personal contact and have given me numerous items for my prayer list. As you reach out to others, you can even ask them how they are managing all this waiting!

The first and foremost thing you can do is pray. Prayer is a very important part of the life of the LWML. Pray for the women in your local group and your zone and district leaders. It is very important to pray for our LWML grant recipients. You can find this list and a little about each grant at [www.lwml.org/mission-grants](http://www.lwml.org/mission-grants). You can find the list of your district grants on your district website. Remember to support those grants financially by prayerfully continuing mite contributions as you are able.

Prayer is vital and praying individually is a good thing. Praying with other people is another blessing. Consider asking your church's group to pray with you at 3:16 every day. This time keeps us focused on John 3:16 which is fundamental to our faith. Sharing prayer requests with each other encourages bonding among us.

Study the Bible with your LWML group. Hold each other accountable. Have phone conversations or video conferences about what you are studying. Find free downloadable LWML Bible studies at [www.lwml.org/bible-studies](http://www.lwml.org/bible-studies). Read the *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly* together. Bible studies from the Fall 2020 *LWQ* are now available as free downloads at [www.lwml.org/lwq-fall-2020](http://www.lwml.org/lwq-fall-2020).

LWML has a new devotion booklet called *Devotions for All Seasons* to encourage you in your walk with God, in whatever season you find yourself. These devotions are centered on the seasons of the year as well as on the seasons of your life. ## An Answer to a Mother's Prayer

As a mother of six, I had to face harsh realities when I realized that my boyfriend of 11 years became addicted to drugs. I tried to stand by his side through failed rehabs, methadone clinics and broken promises. There came a time where I needed to choose to give my children a new life. I found a part-time job and made plans. It was not an easy road, with so many people depending on me. The kids were used to me being a stay at home mom. We all have made changes and sacrifices. I became a single mom. I have been at my job for over a year. My children are safe and comfortable in a tiny, but cozy apartment. I am able to pay the rent. I am able to pay for electricity. I was able to buy a car and I pay for my own insurance. It feels just amazing to see how far my family has come in less than a year! I cannot pretend that we don't struggle. The cost of childcare for three children is a very large percentage of my little paycheck every month. I knew I had to cut corners somewhere. Do I leave my little ones with a downstairs neighbor? Maybe the mom I met at a park? I am embarrassed to say these things have crossed my mind.

This is when I found Little Lambs. I could feel the energy from the moment Jessica answered the phone. I knew this baby wearing, ray of sunshine would be a saving grace. I have finally found a childcare that I could completely put my trust and faith into! I actually cried the first time I spoke to Jessica. She explained how my children and I would be a part of this loving community, this loving family. She explained that my children would be getting a Faith Based Curriculum. (Not having attended Church for years, I have always felt my children were missing something.) I know that there is something bigger than myself at work here. This program has truly been the answer to my prayers. I know my children will be getting everything they need and it allows me to show up to work every day and provide for them. If you see Jessica, please thank her, because I just don't know how to thank a person for the dignity I have knowing I can support my kids on my own."



## **Mentoring and Praying for our Sister Societies...**

### **Let's Remember to Put All Things in God's Hands and Never Give Up**

An inactive LWML group received a grant six years ago for their food pantry. Their LWML had been nonexistent since their LWML President moved. I kept contacting them to encourage and invite them to our events when I was Zone President. It seemed that they just weren't interested. They had too many things going on and they had no one to lead them. This was over a six year period, maybe longer. They had an interim pastor that suggested to me that they be dropped due to inactivity. He felt that things wouldn't change. I told him that we would leave it open and when the time was right, that they would be able to participate again.

Several years back, I called their church secretary, to invite them to another event. During our conversation, she started telling me that they were looking for money for their food pantry. I let her know about the PSD LWML Mission Grant opportunity. At the 2016 Convention, they were selected to receive a \$10,000 grant. After receiving their grant, the secretary called to let me know that the grant not only was a huge help in aiding their food pantry, but that their LWML had taken off and was growing in size continually and was very active in the church and community. After the convention, it was planned that one of our Fall Celebrations would be held at their church. The LWML Zone Women all traveled the distance to the Fall Celebration and had an exceptional experience in worship and enjoyed visiting with over 40 LWML Sisters. Our guest speaker was Dick Gast and his wife who gave a wonderful presentation about the Lutheran Hour Float.

This past fall this LWML group recently elected a new President. As they considered about going to the convention, their LWML was actually wondering how they would be able to pay for the event. I again mentioned that there were funds available through scholarships for First Time Convention attendees. Their group also brainstormed ways that they could raise the other money needed for travel and rooms. When the convention was cancelled, they talked and prayed about what they would do with this money they had raised. "For such a time as this," they graciously decided to donate the \$600 for Mites for Missions, which will now be paid forward for this biennium's Mission Grants. I recently heard a sermon, in which a Pastor pondered, GOD who holds all time and space in His hands, then he drops people in the world at just the right time to make a difference on purpose. Imagine everyone who has ever had a part in this story and others like this one. I imagine many hundreds of people have.

To God be the Glory! I am overwhelmed with joy!
