Learning the Same Thing Again

I am writing this article just a few weeks after I experienced my first LWML retreat. After months of hearing about the retreat and sitting in on meetings, it was great to actually see it all come together. Overall, it was a wonderful time of fellowship, encouragement, worship, and growing in God's word.

Speaking of growing in God's word, one of the takeaways I got from the retreat is when Dr. Kari Vo shared that her devotions for Lutheran Hour are written at a level that is accessible to all. (An upper elementary student or junior-higher could understand them.)

Throughout our lives, we are learning many new things, but when it comes to the Gospel, it isn't so much about learning something new as it is about re-learning the same thing again.

It is certainly appropriate to keep gaining knowledge about God's word. One 15th century prayer suggests that we should "read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest" the word of God.

Luther wrote, "Let nobody suppose that he has tasted the Holy Scriptures sufficiently unless he has ruled over the churches with the prophets for a hundred years" (AE 54:76).

Yes, studying the Word of God and gaining more knowledge of its meaning is important. But there is another side to the study of God's word.

A phrase often attributed to St. Augustine says that the Bible is "shallow enough for a child not to drown, yet deep enough for an elephant to swim."

There is always more to learn about the word of God, but even as we seek to better understand it, we never outgrow the basic message that we first learned in Sunday School:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

2025 Retreat Memories

The Pacific Southwest District held the 2025 Retreat at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Phoenix, AZ from January 24 to 26. The Bible Verse for the weekend was "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer" (Romans 12:12). Our Spiritual Counselor was Rev. Pica, who led all our devotions. The keynote speaker was Dr. Kari Vo from Lutheran Hour Ministries.

Friday

Friday morning there was a tour of the local Orphan Grain Train Site. Several ladies participated in the tour and packed boxes that will be distributed locally. The evening began with dinner. then singing who blessed Elizabeth Schrank. throughout the weekend with song. We were treated to personal experiences about how Jesus is Faithful. The Prayer Pockets were introduced and each retreat participant was then paired up with a prayer partner for the weekend.







Saturday was a busy day which began with singing with Elizabeth and a devotion by Rev. Pica. Then Dr. Vo shared how we can always Rejoice in Hope. We know that Jesus is always there for us and we are always guided by His Plan. We then had our first session, Salvation, of the Bible study lead by Debbie Okubo. She led us in the study "Experience the JOY – then share it!", written by Miriam Maassel Neumann. It is a study on how God's joy acts like a shock absorber against the bumps we encounter here on earth. Service to others helps even out their bumps, too!

We started our breakout sessions:

- Mission Service Activity (prayer books for La Mesa Tempe)
- Prayer Walk-3 stations-
- A. Hope Cards (passing hope to another person)
- B. Tribulation Bible Verses were constructed (reminder to us that "God has this, no matter what!")
- C. Prayer was discussed and shared OR free time with prayer partners

Lunch was served, and then we had session two of the Bible Study, God's Protection, followed by another rotation of the breakout sessions, a third session of Bible study, devotion with dinner, and the last rotation of the breakout sessions.

* Start the day with a blessing: In the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit (with cross on forehead and heart, in honor of my baptism).

*Use a word to help with constructing your prayer:


PRAY = Praise, Repent, Ask, Yield

We had 152 in attendance for the meal and 44 in attendance for the worship service following the meal! 


Considering distributions from your estate that will directly support ministries of the Church may present competing priorities that have existed in you throughout your life.

Mission Grants Training

Our Mission Grants Committee planned and carried out an inviting and thorough Mission Grant training seminar for anyone interested in proposing and submitting a Mission Grant proposal for our next biennium. At least 13 people signed in on the Zoom meeting on February 8, while another 6 who had registered did not make it for this presentation. The seminar was well-received, and all applicants will have one of the committee members serving as their coach throughout the application process.

Melissa Salómon and Maria Espinoza will host two more Zoom seminars, focusing cross cultural ministries, on March 27, 6 pm and March 29, 10 am.

The seminar is now available on our website, <u>www.psdlwml.org</u> under the Mission Grants tab, for anyone to view. The grant application is on the website and may be completed and submitted online; additionally, we have a form that may be printed, completed and mailed in.

The absolute deadline for online submissions is September 30, 2025; for mailed copies it is September 15th. However, we strongly encourage any applicant to work with one of us as a coach and to submit the application as early as possible – August is not too soon – so that any errors, omissions, or incomplete information may be corrected in time to meet the final deadline.

1) Outreach to Students with Disabilities, Trinity Lutheran, St. George Utah...... Trinity Lutheran School has been providing Christian education and Gospel Outreach in the St. George, UT area for over 30 years. - 4. All workers must sign the Acknowledgement of Child Protection Policy.
- 5. A minimum of two unrelated adult workers will be in attendance at all times when children are being supervised during programs and activities.
- 6. Dependent on approval of the Executive Committee, a stipend may be paid to childcare workers.

- Work with Site/Travel Coordinator and seek approval from the Board of Directors if any off-site travel is planned.
